

The Old Baptist Chapel



The Old Baptist Chapel is opposite the street. When you see this sign, please turn right into the alley.



Walk along the alley, then you will see the signs for the chapel.



Here is the Old Baptist Chapel. Turn right and walk through the doorway, you will see the main hall inside. Be careful, there is one step up.



As you walk through the door, there is a reception area in front of you. A member of staff will be behind the desk waiting to welcome you. There is a disabled toilet beside the reception -- just go forward a little bit and you can see it.



On your left-hand side, you can see the overview of the ground floor.



The baptistery is in the middle of the chapel. It may be one of the most eye-catching things in this building.



Here is the pulpit. It is on your left hand side when you go through the door.



On the right side of the pulpit, there is the model of the whole chapel. You can decorate the wooden model with figures and pieces of furniture to see how the building looked in different eras.



Here are some panels on which temporary exhibitions are displayed.



Beside the red board, there are more display panels about the chapel's history and transformation over time.



After you finish viewing the ground floor, there is a staircase for you to go up to the first floor. The stairs are just beside the door you came in.



Here is the first floor. There are sensory chests for different time periods that are relevant to the Chapel throughout history.



This is the whole view of the first floor. There are many educational chests, in which you can explore many interesting replica items from different periods.



This is one of the chests, showing replica items from the 17th century. The helmet is one of the children's favourites.



Here is another chest, where you can find several replica badges popular in the late medieval age.



There are many panels on the wall, which show you the history of the chapel before and during the restoration.



Walk along the corridor, there is another chest beside the window.



Then, turn left, there is a door for a room in the far-left corner. Before entering the room, you can see some exposed wattle and daub and the original painted walls.



Here is the room, which was used as a pastor's office – you can see the ink and quill-pen on the table waiting for use.



On the other side of the room, there is a screen showing you the contents of the Old Baptist Chapel Minute Book. You can also find this book on our website.

After visiting the room, go downstairs, then you are back on the ground floor.



Once you get down the stairs, you will see a fire stove beside the wall.



This is the other door of the chapel, ramp access to the building can be provided from this doorway.
